At the beginning the year the only challenge our committee faced was how we were going to run the club without a President. None of us could have foreseen the turbulent year that 2020 turned into and the further challenges we faced.

But in this unprecedented year, our committee has worked hard to ensure our club has continued to look after the welfare of all our members and get as many players back out on the field, as we could.

Thank you to the Hockey Tasmania Board, and our HT CEO Damian Smith who put in hours of work to get hockey back up & running this season. We wouldn't have had a season at all if it wasn't for their efforts.

Although it was a short season, 2020 has seen another year of achievement and success for OHA, both on and off the field, along with some new initiatives.

2020 saw the pilot of the Premier League Men's Mentoring Juniors Program. Organised by Erin Roehrer with the support of Nick Leslie and our Premier League Men, the program was developed to help create connections between our juniors and A Pool, and create pathways for junior players into A Pool. A program which we will look to extend into the women's side next year.

Junior Clubman and Junior Clubwoman are the most prestigious awards that an OHA junior male and female can have bestowed on them. The award recognises the contribution and commitment a player has given to the club and to the junior grades in particular. This trophy has been awarded since 1981 for males and from 1985 for females.

KEN CLIFFORD ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD FOR BOYS

This award is presented to a junior boy and a junior girl who have demonstrated an outstanding attitude to their hockey. The criteria for this award includes displaying a good attitude to training, being a good team player, regular attendance at trainings and games, being attentive and willing to learn, participation in additional training opportunities, and showing a potential for future development. The award has been presented since 1991

JUNIOR GOALKEEPER OF THE YEAR

Josh Battersby

The trophy is awarded to a female or male goalkeeper playing in a junior grade based on their performance during the season.

THE NATHAN CRESSWELL MEMORIAL TROPHY FOR ENTHUSIASM AND COMMITMENT

Luke Roehrer

Nathan Cresswell was an OHA junior player who tragically lost his life in 2010. The trophy is awarded to a junior player who has displayed enthusiasm and commitment no matter their age, standard or skill level throughout the season. This trophy has been awarded since 2011.

SENIOR PERPETUAL AWARD WINNERS

DEON AND MATTHEW CLIFFORD MEMORIAL TROPHY FOR THE CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR

Hayden Steele

The Clubman trophy is the most prestigious award any male OHA member can have bestowed on them. The award recognises the dedication, commitment and contribution that a male club member has given for the greater benefit of the club.

The Clubman trophy has been awarded since 1949 in some years only, however it has been consistently awarded in every year since 1972.

This award was renamed in 1996 in memory of brothers Deon and Matthew Clifford who tragically lost their lives while bushwalking at the Acropolis near Lake St Clair in the Tasmanian highlands. Deon and Matthew were dedicated OHA players and were both recipients of the Junior Clubman Trophy. Deon won the award in 1986 and Matthew in 1990 and 1991.

CLUBWOMAN OF THE YEAR

Erin Roehrer

The Clubwoman Trophy is the most prestigious award any female OHA member can have bestowed on them. The award recognises the dedication, commitment and contribution that a female club member has given for the greater benefit of the club. The trophy has been awarded since 1979.

THE OHA ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Camilla Winch

This award recognises an individual's outstanding contribution to hockey as an administrator, umpire, player or coach with a focus on achievements outside of OHA. This trophy was donated by the Murton and McLeod families and has been awarded since 2005.

JACK SPENCER – BEST PERFORMED TEAM

Second Grade Men

Jack Spencer created this award to recognise the best performed team each season. Jack made a major contribution to OHA as a player, coach and administrator for many years and was also a strategic member of the club's first A-Grade premiership team in 1959. The trophy has been awarded since 1990.

SENIOR PERPETUAL AWARD WINNERS

BEST UNDER 21 PLAYER

Joesph Murphy

This trophy is awarded to a female or male playing in the senior grades. The award takes into consideration the individual's club performance as well as their intra-state, Tasmanian or Australian representation. This trophy has been awarded since 1975.

BEST FIRST YEAR PLAYER IN PREMIER LEAGUE

Isabelle Kruimink

This trophy recognises a female or male playing in their first full year as a member of the starting eleven in a Premier League team. The award takes into consideration the individual's club performance as well as their intra-state, Tasmanian or Australian representation. The trophy has been awarded in various years since 1954 and continuously since 1990.

CRAIG THOMPSON ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD FOR UMPIRING

Josh Foulston & Jayden Vince

Craig 'Thommo' Thompson was a legend in the club and was widely regarded by all who played alongside him together with those on opposing sides. He was renowned for his disputes with umpires and his regular comments to his team mates, and to his wife Kate about the decisions the umpires made and how the game needed better umpires. For this reason Kate believes that having a club trophy in memory of 'Thommo' may encourage people within the club to volunteer to umpire and to improve the standard of umpiring generally.

The award recognises a club member who has demonstrated a substantial commitment to umpiring during the season. This trophy has been awarded since 2006.

PETER VERRELL GOALKEEPER OF THE YEAR MEMORIAL TROPHY

Evie Dalton & Alyssa Marmion

The Goalkeeper of the Year is awarded to a senior female or male goalkeeper for a consistent performance during the year. Peter Verrell was a goalkeeper in the B Pool grades during the 1970s and early 1980s. He created this goalkeeper award in 1980 to recognise the contribution that goalkeepers make to the club and after he tragically died in 1984, the trophy was renamed in his memory.

SENIOR PERPETUAL AWARD WINNERS

HIGHEST GOAL SCORER

David Woolford – 19 goals

This trophy is awarded to the player who scores the highest number of goals in a season in any senior grade. The trophy has been awarded in most years since 1956 and continuously since 1986.

ROBERT TURNER MEMORIAL TROPHY

Martin Skeggs

Robert Turner was a strong and integral member of the 3rd Grade men's team in the 1970s. Following his tragic death in 1977 a trophy was dedicated to him. The trophy is awarded to a 3rd Grade player for their contribution to the team throughout the season. The award is decided by the vote of the members of the 3rd Grade team. This trophy has been awarded every year since 1977.

REBECCA RYAN MEMORIAL TROPHY

Alyssa Marmion

Bec Ryan passed away in 2013 having played for OHA at both a junior and senior level from 2000 until 2010. She was always very determined and never let ill health prevent her from playing hockey. Bec will be remembered as a person who had a positive approach to life and tried her utmost to achieve what she set out to do. Despite her illness, she completed her medical degree and began work as a doctor in 2013. Bec was very much a team player and was always strongly supportive of her friends and colleagues. She will be remembered always for her beautiful smile, her courage and her enthusiasm for life.

This award is for a player who is very determined, sets goals and achieves what they set out to do. It is for a player who has a positive approach to life, and is supportive of friends and colleagues – doing anything for anyone, anytime.

This award is voted on by current OHA members and coaching staff within the A-Pool Women's squad.

This trophy has been awarded since 2013.

LIFE MEMBER INDUCTEE

CHRIS SARGENT

Chris started his playing days with OHA as a seven-year-old in the Under 13 competition in 1981.

Chris won many Best and Fairest and Most Consistent awards throughout his junior years and was named the Junior Clubman of the year recipient in 1990. Chris was an U/17 State representative in 1991.

Chris' senior debut was in A-Reserve (now 1st Grade) and A-Grade (now Premier League) in 1990.

He has played in numerous senior A-Grade, A-Reserve, Second Grade, and Masters Grand Finals over many years.

Chris has won five A-Reserve State premierships over two decades, the first in 1993, then 1996, and again in 2008, 2010 and 2011.
3 Master Div 1 Premierships in 2013, 2014 and 2018
3 Second Grade Premierships in 2015, 2018 and 2020

Chris has always given to the club that has given to him. This is true both on and off the field.

He has been a nominee for the Deon and Matthew Clifford Memorial Clubman of the year award no less than ten times, winning it a record three times.

He has coached numerous junior teams from a young age.

U/13, U/17 Boys and U/17 Girls, and then again in recent years with the successful U/13 Girls, which Chris' daughter Amber was a member.

He has coached A-Reserve Men on two occasions in the late 90's and again in the late 2000's for a total of 5 seasons.

Chris spent seven years in Melbourne for professional reasons but always kept OHA close to his heart. When he left in June 2001, he was coaching A-Reserve Men. He always felt that he owed it to the club to return and complete his commitment.

He played and coached in Melbourne at a standard that would see him return to Hobart in 2007, where he resumed the coaching position of the A-Reserve team.

He sees the 2008 A-Reserve State premiership as one of his proudest hockey moments. Chris took the role as the Playing Coach after the team had not made finals in over a decade and had been on a 35 game losing streak. He led them to be State Premiers in 2008 and runners-up in 2009. The same team then went on to win back-to-back State premierships in 2010 and 2011.

The 2008 premiership win holds a special place for Chris as he played alongside his brother Phil (also a Life Member), for Phil's first-ever senior premiership for OHA.

Again with his brother Phil, Chris was a member of the first-ever Division One Masters Team to win their maiden premiership in 2013 and took back-to-back premierships by winning again in 2014.

Chris has been a passionate committee and administrative club member over several years. First in 1995 – 1998 and again in 2010-2014. In 2010-2014 he held the roles of Vice President, Fund Raising and Sponsorship Officer and the Chairman of the 75th Celebrations of the men's side of the club.

His pursuit for innovative ideas saw him develop, fund and drive the successful 'Source from Within' publication which raised over \$40K for the club over the first ten editions.

Chris' commitment to the club goes unseen by many. This is how he likes it. He works behind the scenes giving both time and in-kind donations without hesitation. He loves this club and would do anything to see it be the best it can be.

His behind-the-scenes' in-kind' attitude and approach have significantly contributed to the club's off-field

successes. There are too many to mention, and he wouldn't want them known anyway!

Chris was the Chairman of the OHA Centenary Committee, formed in 2015, some four years before the 2019 Centenary year. He guided the devoted Centenary Committee on a course to see the club celebrate the year in style, and size, such a milestone like it deserved.

From newspaper, TV, and media highlights to the all-in club Green Day and OHA 100 Auction in the middle of the year through to the Junior and Senior Gala Celebrations in October, the committee worked

tirelessly to ensure the year celebrated all things OHA. The Auction ended up being the club's largest-ever fundraising event.

The Gala events were the largest ever gathering of past and present players, members, and supporters in the club's history. With over 500 attendees across the two events.

Anyone who attended these events will remember and cherish them forever.

Chris' unwavering commitment, passion, and dedication, coupled with his selfless, energetic attitude, is why Chris Sargent is now our newest Life Member of the OHA Hockey Club.



LIFE MEMBER INDUCTEE

STEPH O'MAY

Tonight it is my privilege to speak about Steph O'May and welcome her to a very exclusive club, one many of us would love to be a member of. The members of this club all have one thing in common a deep commitment to OHA and Steph has commitment to this club in shiploads.

Steph joined OHA in the 80's as a young junior, following in the sporting footsteps of her mother, who played hockey in her school days. Steph had been playing school hockey and was ready to begin playing for a club, but which club would she choose? It really wasn't much of a choice. Her brother was already playing for OHA and young Steph's parents were good friends with John and Sue Sargent. Steph was friends with the Sargent boys, plus she lived on the Eastern shore. And so began Steph's connection to the OHA hockey club.

Steph has been a part of many successful premierships teams. Her first premiership was in 1986 as part of the Under 16 team. She began her senior career playing with A-pool before joining second grade where she became part of a team that went on to win back to back to back premierships.

Over the years she has won best and fairest awards and most consistent player, she has captained, coached and managed teams. Played in many different positions and been awarded a card or two for that allusive but usually effective swinging tackle, but these are not things that Steph is best known for.

So what is Steph best known for....in our team it's delicious cheesecakes, running bootcamp sessions, creating our greenlow medal, organisation and commitment.

I think for most of us Steph and the words organisation and commitment go hand in hand.

14 years ago, Steph decided to join the OHA committee, in 2010 she agreed to take on the role of secretary of the OHA hockey club. When I was a junior coordinator – Steph was always there helping however she could. She could find old letters and forms, supplying and helping to organise registrations...If I needed an extra set of hands for a clinic or some U8 and U10 coaching I could always rely on Steph's support.

I never needed to ask she just offered, never expecting anything in return. I will always be eternally grateful for all of the extra help that you gave me whilst I was on the committee.

Including tonight, stepping up for our club and presenting the presidents report in what has been a difficult year for our club, without a president.

- Over the years Steph has helped with both junior and senior presentation nights, setting up, presenting awards, organising slideshows.

Steph has been awarded a Southern Hockey League Certificate of Appreciation in 2016 and 2017, this was in recognition for taking on the role of acting SCC Secretary when needed, which she did just to help out. She has been awarded Clubwoman of the Year twice and has been nominated numerous times over the past 10 years. But Steph isn't driven by awards or recognition, if anything Steph isn't a big fan of the spotlight.

Steph is driven by her love of the club, helping others and being part of a team. Steph is proud of the history of OHA and the strong family values of our club.

Her husband has often commented that he thinks she loves OHA more than him, which of course isn't true, but OHA is a huge part of who she is – it's family.

OHA has been a big part of her life since she joined the club as a junior in the 80's, playing pretty much non-stop since, and I don't think she's likely to give it up anytime soon...

The U15 boys put a show on in the 2020 season. After a delayed start to the season, the boys came to the first training session with one goal in mind, making the grand final. They had their eyes set on this goal all season and this focus showed at the end of the season as we qualified for the final with relative ease. This team consisted of a group that showed no weakness. Every player played their role to perfection which allowed us to perform at our best every game. Led by young premier league player Mac Winch, and first grade players Oscar Lucas and Josh Battersby, the team showed confidence in each player as they all adopted a team first mentality. This mentality allowed us to achieve what we did throughout the season and pull of an unexpected upset in the grand final.

The team was made up of mostly underage players. Out of the 14 players that played in our team this year, only 3 were 15 years old. However, if you saw the way the players conducted themselves both at trainings and games, you would have been surprised to hear this. The group showed an impressive maturity throughout the season. This maturity allowed the group to get the most out of the sessions that we had together. Our trainings consisted of focusing on our game plan that I was trying to implement, which involved a

lot of repetition. To the players' credit, they never complained which meant we were able to get the boring stuff out of the way early before we had a bit of fun towards the end of trainings. This made my job as coach so much easier and more enjoyable.

After a delayed start to the season due to Coronavirus, the U15 boys started their season with a dominant performance against University, beating them 7-0. They then backed this result up with a 4-0 win against Derwent. Unfortunately, we lost our first game of the season 3-1 to DiamondBacks in our first meeting of the season. We then hit form and won 3 games in a row, total scores of 11-1. We then lost again to DiamondBacks 3-1, before finishing the season of strongly against North West, winning by 4 goals.

We finished the season with a 6-2 record, good enough for second place. Despite not having a goalkeeper for the regular season, we finished with the 2nd best defensive record, only conceding 7 goals, whilst having the best goalscoring record, scoring 28 goals in our 8 games. Our leading goal scorer was Mac Winch 10 goals.

We qualified for the grand final as the second placed team. We matched up against DiamondBacks, who had beaten

us two times during the season. We unfortunately lost two of our key young players due to injury for the grand final. Fortunately, we were able to acquire two players from the U13 team. One of these players stepped up and played goalkeeper for us. This was a position that we had not have filled this season and was a welcome change. 13-year-old Josh Hamilton- Humphries put the pads on for the game and was a game changer. He made multiple big saves during the course of the match, keeping a clean sheet in his first game in U15's. We would not have won the game if it had not been for his brilliant performance.

The match was extremely even for the majority of the game. Our defence held strong, led by Oscar Lucas and Rhys Wilkinson, who both snuffed out all opportunities for DiamondBacks. Our captain, Mac Winch, controlled the game through the midfield, creating many opportunities for our dangerous forwards. Tommy Cuthbert and Ben Sargent were finding good pace up front and both nearly scored that goal we needed to take the lead.

The game ended up scoreless during regular time and went to extra time. The extra time did not produce any goals meaning we went to shoot outs.

First grade goalkeeper Josh Battersby, who had spent the entire match playing centre half, put on his pads for the shoot outs and showed his class. DiamondBacks took the first shoot out, which Josh calmly took care of. Oscar Lucas then stepped up for our first shoot out and expertly slotted it home to give us a 1-0 lead. DiamondBacks scored the next shoot out and we missed making the score 1-1. Battersby then denied the next 2 DiamondBacks

shooters and gave them both no chance to round him. Mac Winch then stepped up and converted his shoot out to give us a 2-1 lead going into the final attempts.
