2021 PRESIDENTS REPORT

2021 didn't quite come out from behind the cloud of COVID-19 but with the help of the government and their implementation of strict border controls, Hockey Tasmania were able to produce a successful season for all A-Pool, B-Pool and Junior teams. The role of President on the OHA committee had been vacant for 12 months and I saw this as my opportunity to test myself and give back to the hockey club that had given so much to me. OHA's ability to successfully operate for an entire year without a president identified to me that the OHA ship worked just fine, it merely need a rudder to continue to steer it in the right direction. With the 100th year of OHA 2 years in the rear view mirror, the sponsorship contract and agreements that had been so well set up by David McCambridge during his presidency, were nearing their end date in 2022 and I as well as the committee knew securing funding for future seasons would be our biggest task for the year. The Choices Flooring contract was set to expire at the end of 2021, the Brunswick Hotel contract also at the end of 2021 and the Batteryworld contract to run until the end of 2022. This process and our beloved pub nights were also thrown the ultimate curveball when an accidental fire all but burnt the Brunswick Hotel to the ground.

The Brunswick Hotel had been our club pub for over 5 years prior and the whole OHA committee was saddened to see it go. Nevertheless, OHA members were just happy to be back at the hockey centre and to have the opportunity to continue to play the game they loved. Junior numbers slipped slightly but the club was still able to field a team in every division, with the U15 boys and the U18 girls winning premierships. B-Pool numbers were extremely healthy with 12 teams entered in total and 4th Grade men Red and the Premier League women winning premierships. The biggest uptake in participation however has been seen in the Master's competitions with teams in all divisions. Numbers in the umpiring space dropped slightly through players moving to clubs and this has created a significant focus point for the committee for the 2022 season. The overall direction of the committee this year was to ensure we devoted our focus to supporting all teams and retention of players going forward.

It was an absolute pleasure to lead this club in 2021 and with the strong network of club members I am sure we will continue to thrive in the years ahead.

PAUL BLOOMFIELD

Paul Bloomfield has been a member of the OHA Hockey Club for more than 30 years, transitioning to OHA through the Wybia Hockey Club in 1985 and establishing himself as a solid lower grades player and an on-field leader.

Paul's impact on the OHA Hockey Club probably started to emerge in the late 1990s and the early 2000s when he took on coaching and co-ordinating the 4th Grade team. B Pool men over a number of years had continued to grow as a result of the successful junior recruitment and flow on effects from the 1990s and 2000s. While most of us recognised this growth Paul did something about it. He worked with other like-minded individuals in the club to add teams to accommodate the numbers. This led to the establishment of a rag tag second 4th grade men's team in 2008. In 2009 he was instrumental in establishing the 5th Grade team where he welcomed all and sundry and developed a culture that reflects the OHA values. For more than a decade Paul has coached and managed these two teams, with 5th Grade achieving premierships in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. While he was coaching 5th Grade he has continued to mentor coaches and players in other teams,

and at one stage I would have described him as team manager and psychologist for 4th Grade Blue! He continued dedicating his time and perseverance to 4th Grade attempting to manage the unmanageable. His frustration was rarely seen although some bulldozer tackles were felt by many opposition players. The OHA Hockey Club's success in the lower grades has been a big part of the club's success and Paul has played an important role in delivering this success.

Paul's dedication to the club has extended beyond the lower grades, having contributed as President (2006-2007), vice President, Treasurer and committee member at numerous times during his membership. All the roles Paul took on he pursued with vigour and enthusiasm. He was very strategic in his thinking and importantly influenced many others on the committee and within Hockey South to engage clubs and the sport's future development.

During his time as President, OHA was going through a rebuild stage and Paul was pivotal in the development of the club's strategic vision to build through significant junior development. While this may sound simple, the key was to develop, recruit and

importantly retain our junior players. Under his watch he ensured critical support was provided to the junior co-ordinators and the development of the program, which ultimately saw success in future years. Many may not have initially recognised his vision, in those days where we were often used to doing the 'same old thing'. But Paul's vision worked and the results flowed and OHA has continued to grow as a successful family club and became that powerhouse in hockey.

Paul's leadership style is another feature of this contribution to the club. Paul has coached, mentored and supported many young players and coaches throughout their journey with the club. He has introduced many older players to new experiences in the game through the 4th and 5th Grade systems. He has also supported a number of younger players to renew their interest and encourage them not to give up on the sport.

Some observations have been made by Paul's team mates from more recent years.

"He is someone who quietly and astutely sees the opportunities to improve the on and off and field culture and performance of our club, can translate his thoughts into actions and influences others to come on the journey. I have watched him go about the business of improving our club with confidence, grace, humility and inclusion." – Matt Sargent.

"As a newcomer to OHA and hockey in general. I can vouch for the welcoming culture in OHA where he made me feel like a part of the group from the first day. There was never an undue focus on results and dilution of culture and ethics thereof. Personally, I am very grateful for ever ... diversity and inclusion is unfortunately at a premium".

A comment which Paul used at many a committee meeting when we were in the weeds (while gesticulating with this hands) 'Guys, guys, look at the big picture'. Exactly what he did and continues to do with some of that picture in this room tonight.

I would invite you all to welcome Paul Bloomfield as a life member of the OHA Hockey Club, congratulations Paul it's been a privilege.

LIFE MEMBER INDUCTEE

GERNOT ROEHRER

Gernot has been a member of OHA since 1997 and demonstrates passion for the betterment of the club, both on and off the field. His consistent and dedicated efforts are evident through the efficient management of the club's financial resources and the coaching of both junior and senior teams.

As a player Gernot is both energetic and a team player. He continues to mentor others, even when not in a coaching role, and adapts to a team in the multiple positions he plays. He takes the time to understand the strengths and challenges of each player and gives them opportunities to extend and showcase their skill set. He places the needs of his team mates above his, placing others in positions where they and the team will gain most benefit.

As indicated earlier, Gernot started his hockey career with OHA playing with both the Under 17's and 2nd Grade sides in 1997. He then had a break attending University in Launceston before returning in 1999 playing for 4th Grade through to 2004. In 2005 he stepped up to 3rd Grade and in 2018 he reached the magical age of "Masters". He is currently playing both 3rd Grade and 4th Grade ... the latter as playing coach and

he is also playing in the Masters Division 2 competition.

Gernot has represented OHA in the National Masters Competition in 2017 with the Over 40 Tasmanian team and was the manager for Tasmanian Under 12 boy's team in 2019.

This season Gernot is the coach for the Under 13 Division 2 boys and a co-coach for the Under 15 and Under 18 teams. Gernot is one of the first to put up his hand to help with the teams, both in club and for school hockey, in which both of his sons are involved. Gernot coaches so that players can understand how they fit into the game plan and encourages players to strive for continuous development and enjoyment of the game. Gernot's easy-going and approachable manner has meant that several older players returning to the game have quickly become confident within the 3rd Grade Blue team.

Gernot's involvement in the club is that of a quiet achiever. He doesn't think twice about offering a hand in the many social, administrative or playing aspects of the club. He has been a recipient of the "Robert Turner Memorial Trophy" on three occasions along with the prestigious "Clubman of the Year"

award in 2017. He gains enjoyment from seeing OHA go from strength to strength and attributes successes to the team.... that is ... the "OHA family".

Gernot has been a committee member for 12 years and has also represented OHA on the odd Hockey Tasmania committees. As treasurer Gernot has implemented several initiatives that, while resulting in a few grey hairs (in his beard), have assisted the club to be able to invest back into the players and develop the OHA community over the years. The role of the treasurer has required countless hours of work and collaboration with other committee members and Gernot achieves this quietly and without fuss. Over the years Gernot has ensured OHA is well equipped to support our growing junior numbers and the development of our upcoming senior players. Gernot is the longest serving treasurer on the committee, with 2021 being his 10th year as treasurer although I'm not sure but it may be his last ... having recently left the supposed less demanding position in the Public Service to the Private Sector. There are a lot of hours and administrative work that goes into being the treasurer for a club of OHA's size, and Gernot has put the hours in to make sure we continue to go from strength to strength.

As Gernot approaches his 25th year of membership with the club it is evident that he is a passionate and involved member of OHA in all aspects of hockey. He is a respected

member of the hockey community and continues to support the junior, senior and community aspects of OHA.

JOHN CRANWELL

John Cranwell started playing hockey in Grade 3 at Howrah Primary School which was a feeder school for the OHA Hockey Club. He joined the OHA Hockey Club in 1973, over 48 years ago, at the age of 12, playing for the Under 14 side. In that year he was selected to play for the Tasmanian Under 12 boys team. He continued through the junior ranks playing in Under 16s and Under 18s.

He made his senior debut in 1978, playing in the A Reserve team through to 1981. Over this period John spent time serving on the OHA General Committee, as it was the practice in those days to encourage younger club members to participate and learn about the administration of the club. John also took on junior coaching roles, as was also the practice in those days, coaching primary school sides from Warrane Primary.

In 1991 John was again playing A Reserve with OHA and did so until 1994, winning a premiership in 1993 and coaching the side to a grand final in 1994. In 1995 he moved to 2nd Grade and this team won three consecutive premierships from 1996 to 1998.

John coached OHA Under 14 girls in 1996, Under 16 girls in 1997 and Under 14 girls

in 2022.

During the 2000s John played an important role in organising and coaching hockey sides for the Southern Primary Schools Sports Association winter carnival. Many of these players found their way to the OHA junior ranks, thanks to John's guidance.

In 2005 John played 3rd Grade, coaching the side to a premiership in 2007. In 2007 John was the assistant coach of the Tasmanian Under 13 boy's team. From 2008-2011 he coached the Tasmanian Under 13 boy's team. In 2013 John was the assistant coach of the Tasmanian Under 16 boy's team.

In 2010 John was assistant coach of the OHA A Reserve premiership team. In 2014 he played 4th Grade where he still plays today. He has coached the team on five occasions, winning premierships in 2011, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020. John has played Masters hockey since 2010.

John has won several awards for the club. In 1980 he won the A Reserve Most Consistent, in 2005 the 3rd Grade Most Consistent, in 2007 the Robert Turner Memorial Trophy, in 2012 the 4th Grade Best and Fairest and in

2016 the 4th Grade Best and Fairest.

John has had a long association with the OHA Hockey Club. As player he has made a significant contribution to the success of the club. To step up from player to coach requires an even greater commitment and John has done this on many occasions. He is renowned for his thoroughness in preparation and planning and this has been consistently evident in the success he has had for the club.

John has been an experienced and dedicated teacher of hockey to juniors, within the OHA Hockey Club, the state school system and for Hockey Tasmania. Talk with any parent of a child who has been coached by John Cranwell and you will receive a glowing report on his abilities.

John's participation in the lower grades of the club has been outstanding, demonstrating over many years his ability to pull players together to field teams. He has been instrumental in convincing several younger players to return to play hockey for the club and has encouraged them to move on to higher grades.

John is held in the highest regard by his team mates and fellow club members.

John is one of those club members who always stands ready to take on tasks and responsibility in assisting the club to achieve its goals. He is a very worthy Life Member.

THE OHA 100 CLUB - GAMES PLAYED

INTRODUCTION

Guidelines have been developed to provide a consistent approach for the recording of the number of games played for the Club by our members. The guidelines below also attempt to provide a fair assessment taking into consideration the changes in the Club teams over 100 years. For example, prior to the 1990's the majority of players played in only one grade in a season, compared to the present where some players play in a number of grades.

This information has been included in a database which details the games played by every OHA player from 1919 to the present. In the future, at the completion of each season, the database will be updated based on the SHL records for that season. The information will be available through the OHA SHIPS Log Book, to all club members, coaches and managers, to record and celebrate significant games milestones by individual players.

GUIDELINES

Games played are recorded for senior grades only and include finals matches as appropriate.

Senior grades include the Masters Grade.

Where historical documents (eg; team sheets, coaches records, SHL data base [from 2016-onwards]) were available, the games played have been determined from these documents.

Where these documents were not available, the games played (including finals) have assumed to be 15-18 (based on 3 rounds) or 20-23 (based on 4 rounds) depending on the number of finals matches played.

Where a player played in more than one grade during a season, a maximum of 35 games have been recorded for that player (eg; 20 games from 3rd Grade and 15 games from 2nd grade; or 18 games from 2nd Grade and 17 games from Masters).

As the SHL data base also records those players named as interchange players, these games have been included accordingly. (eg; a 4th grade player who plays 20 games in 4th Grade and is reserve for 4 games in 3rd Grade will have 24 games recorded for the season).

Where a goalie played in goal in one grade and on the field in another a maximum of 35 games have been recorded.

AMENDMENTS TO GAMES PLAYED

The following table lists the games played for each OHA club member based on the above guidelines and the information we have been able to access to date.

If any individual member wishes to review their personal games record, feel free to contact me (see contact details below) to arrange this. We are also keen to update the data base based on any new documentation (eg; old team books, club records, personal records, team photographs, newspaper articles) so if anyone has this information please let me know, and we can amend the data base accordingly.
