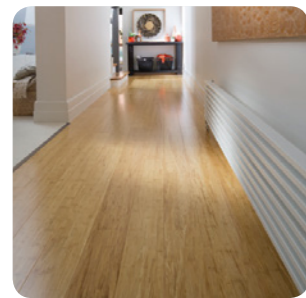

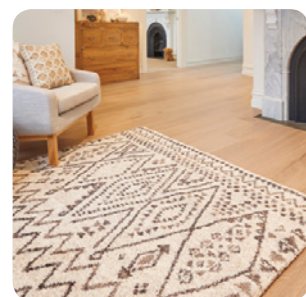

2022 PRESIDENTS REPORT

The OHA 2022 season could not have happened without the efforts of our volunteers, members, sponsors and our passionate and dedicated committee members, and I thank every one of you.

I acknowledge our Life Members and those members we have lost this year.

In the junior space, we supported teams in Stick2Hockey, Full Field Mixed, Under 13s, Under 15s and Under 18s with teams competing in finals. The Under 18 women won their grand final.

Our senior grades consisted of 19 men's and women's teams across 9 grades. Three teams won minor premierships and a total of 10 teams made finals. 2nd Grade Men and 3rd Grade Men Blue won their grand finals.

The club experienced several issues around providing umpires at the Premier League level and in the lower grades. Due to the hard work of Raja Iyer whom I thank greatly, we were able to overcome the shortfall, however as a club we need to do more to support our umpires.

Club membership currently sits at 369 which is slightly down on previous years. It should be the intent of the incoming committee to look at strategies to increase our membership base going forward. The club will see movement of players from club to club in the off season and need to focus on maintaining player numbers and teams in the competition.

The club's strategic plan, established in 2017, is due for review in January 2023. The club constitution remains up to date, however needs reviewing to bring it in to line with current conventions and practices. It should be the focus of the 2023 Committee to review the constitution and present amendments to the club community at a Special General Meeting later in 2023.

The club's association with the Good Sport's program has been maintained in 2022, however will require a review in 2023.

This year saw the launch of the 100 Years - OHA Hockey Club 1919-2019 history book. One hundred copies of the book were ordered with another 20 copies to be printed in a second print run. This achievement was a testament to the dedicated efforts in researching and writing a comprehensive history of the club. Again we thank the sub-committee involved in the book and make specific mention to Robyn and John McCambridge.

The club's annual Presentation Night and Dinner was again a success and I am confident in saying that all those who attended, had a fabulous night. Attendance was slightly down due to players with Hockey One and Australian Masters Championships commitments. I congratulate all award winners including our new Life Member inductee Rowan Bridley.

The club's off-field functions and club nights were limited this year however those held were successful. Poor ticket sales for the 100 club saw

the event cancelled and it is hoped that greater support will be given to the event going forward as it is a major fundraiser.

The club supported a number of community based events in 2022. These included the Point 2 Pinnacle, the Cadbury Marathon and the Run the Bridge fun run. Thanks to Phil Sargent for his organisation of officials for these events.

This year it was my intention to establish the role of Junior Development Officer who would work in schools and introduce school aged players to the sport. Unfortunately, due to a number of factors, this did not eventuate and now should be a focus for 2023. I thank Graham Cowie for supporting this initiative and I look forward to Battery World's support going forward.

The club was well represented in Tasmanian teams across all age groups from Masters, Hockey One and juniors. I congratulate all OHA representatives for their efforts in making teams and maintaining the dedication and commitment required to play at a high level.

I would like to acknowledge all players who reached playing milestones in 2022. Some stand out achievements were James McLeod 1009, Helen Mulcahy 604, James Cowling, Damien Smith and Andrew Byrne in excess of 600 games and those achieving 500 were Jane Clark 501, Paul Bloomfield 501 and Brian Gillie 505 games. Congratulations to all. This is not to detract from those who reached their own milestones over the year and continue to do so. All statistics can

be found in the 2022 OHA Ships Logbook on our webpage. Thanks again to John McCambridge for compiling these records.

We are grateful for the continued support of our sponsors; Choices Flooring, Battery World, The Queens Head Hotel, Tas Sports Physio, The Trophy Cabinet, Hobart Specialist Dental Centre, The McDevitt family and Grinners Dive Bar. Without their support, OHA would struggle to survive as a financial club.

The 2023 season looks to be an exciting year ahead. Both our Premier League teams will see new coaching staff bring a different focus to the teams. Some of our younger players are stepping up into higher grades. The focus of the Committee should be to drive recruitment at all levels, but more in the junior space for the longevity of the club. A review of the club constitution and Strategic Plan is required. To achieve this, a sub-committee could be established to allow the Committee to focus on the club proper. Long term sponsorship agreements are to be established. The club webpage will require review and upgrading. This is important not only in maintaining community involvement but to also attract new club members.

I thank the outgoing committee and welcome the new committee to an exciting and fabulous community club that is OHA.

Vale - Lyndsay McLeod

The club's oldest Life Member Lyndsay McLeod, who was inducted in 1998 was legendary in hockey circles.

Lyndsay's involvement with hockey began in the 1940s. He played hockey at Hobart High School from 1944, captaining the team in 1947 and 1948. After leaving school Lyndsay played for the Baptist Hockey Club. He joined OHA in 1974 playing in the 4th Grade team which won the premiership in 1978. He was also a member of the 4th Grade team which won a premiership and State Final

in 1993. In 1980, Lyndsay won the 5th Grade Best and Fairest award, and in 1982 he won the Veterans Best and Fairest.

In 1952, Lyndsay was captain of the Tasmanian Under 21 team and later, when playing for OHA, he represented Tasmania in the Australian Veterans Championships in 1990 and 1995. Lyndsay was the patron of OHA for a number of years in the 1990s and in 2001 was recognised for his contribution to the FIH Junior Men's World Cup. Lyndsay was a match manager for many years and was a regular spectator watching his children and grand children play for OHA.

Affectionately known around hockey, Lynds would always be that guy who gave you the extra bit of motivation to have a good game when you knew he was there to watch. A post and sometimes pre-game 'good luck' or deep discussion about the game was a game day must on a Saturday which always felt like we had the edge over the other side.

Growing up around hockey, like most of the club members, you were never too far away from a McLeod playing/watching/supporting and if that McLeod was Lyndsay, it was always enough to get a smile on your face. If you were lucky enough to know and speak to this kind, passionate, respected, gentle soul you should feel extremely privileged as many of us do. I challenge any person to find one bad thing to say about him as he was just one of the nice guys, a gentleman and a family man through and through. We'll miss you Lynds and whilst you have left us, you will always be in our thoughts.

Vale - David Driver

It was with great sadness that the OHA club farewelled a second Life Member, David Driver who was inducted in 1979.

As a former student of Hobart High School, it was natural that David would one day play for OHA. He joined OHA in 1957 in A2 Grade playing two seasons. In 1960, he played 2nd Grade and after injury returned in 1969 to play 3rd Grade, 4th Grade and Veterans over the next two decades. In 1974 and 1975 he won the Best and Fairest

for 4th Grade and the following year the Most Consistent award. In 1974, 1976 and 1978 he won premierships with the 4th Grade team.

David coached junior teams for OHA - the Under 17 Boys team in 1982, Under 16 Girls in 2000 and Under 18 Girls in 2001. David also coached Southern junior teams and was awarded a State Umpiring Badge.

In 1982, David was selected in the inaugural Tasmanian Veterans team and he coached the Tasmanian Under 15 team in 1985. Off the field, David contributed to the club in administrative roles. He was treasurer in 1971, secretary in 1972 and president in 1975 and 1976. During his presidency, David introduced the role of junior co-ordinator/coach within the club and implemented junior programs, and coached at Howrah Primary School which over time became a recruitment base for the club. He was also involved in the Southern Hockey Association's development of an Under 10 competition in 1980.

David will be missed by our club, to which he contributed so much.

history in 2013. Robyn said she was inspired and driven by the challenge laid down by fellow Life Member John Sargent. John wrote the club's first history book, 'We are OHA - Reflections and Collections 1936-1997' and challenged someone to document the history of the women's side of the club. This challenge evolved into a meticulous history of the women's club from 1919 and the men's club from 1936.

Robyn has produced possibly the most detailed history book ever written on a hockey club or hockey in general within Australia. The dedication and commitment that Robyn has applied to produce the 100 years of history has been remarkable. The enormous amount of hours, research, reading, documentation, clarification and approvals required to make the book possible is outstanding.

The book was officially launched at the Tasmanian Hockey Centre on 13 August, at an event attended by more than 80 club members, supporters and hockey enthusiasts.

Robyn's son, David (a former club president) opened proceedings with some reflections and recognition of what a huge task this has been.

'The foundations of our club were borne in friendship, fitness, enjoyment and fun. Values of family, club culture, mate-ship, and enjoyment are at the core of OHA and provide the foundation of our on and off-field success,' David said.

David also paid tribute to those who assisted in the many forms of support and expertise.

'It has been a mammoth project involving a large number of people, proof reading, analysing data, editing, collecting memorabilia, photographing, annotating and reviewing. I would like to thank them on behalf of the club for their generous time and effort to bring this amazing publication to us.'

'There are 36,555 editions of the newspaper between 1919 and 2019. I'm fairly sure that Robyn has reviewed almost every one.'

David then highlighted Robyn's commitment to the club.

'She was and is a player, parent, committee member, junior coordinator, coach, mentor, historian, centenary committee member and Life Member. The time commitment of just the above to OHA likely pales into insignificance compared with the task of thoroughly researching, collating and writing this book,' he said.

'Robyn, you are an inspiration and a treasure of both the OHA hockey club and our family. Few people will ever truly appreciate the toil and labour you have undergone to get to today. Thank you, thank you so much for bringing together this journal of our great club.'

Hockey Tasmania CEO and dedicated OHA club member Damian Smith shared a few of his own words on what a significant occasion the launch of the book was. Damian commented on Robyn's dedication to the sport of hockey, and the proud history OHA had within Tasmania. As a club member, Damian reflected on what a family club OHA is. This family feel has created a rich culture of inclusiveness, camaraderie, and enjoyment for all family members - mums, dads, sons and daughters. There are very few sports that can offer and achieve this.

Life Member Nic Turner interviewed a panel of three Life Members and Robyn herself. Nikki Stuart, Peter Woolford, John Sargent and Robyn reflected on past years and how hockey and our club had developed and matured.

Our rich 100-year history has faced many challenges on and off the field. That said, it was agreed that our family club is full of dedicated and

committed members who want to achieve the best possible outcomes to embrace and enhance what our club represents and stands for.

The motto for the Centenary was 'Celebrating the past and inspiring our future'. This publication does just that. Robyn was elated that she had finished the publication, and it could now be shared for generations to come.

Nic wrapped up the proceedings by thanking Robyn and everyone who attended, which was followed by drinks and nibbles and an opportunity to mingle and reminisce.

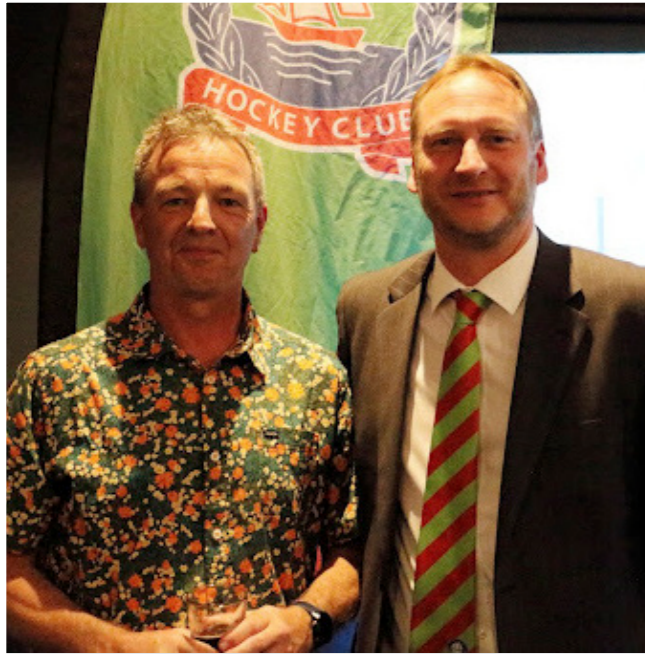

ROWAN BRIDLEY

Rowan Bridley commenced his hockey career in 1981 as an 11 year old at Lindisfarne Primary School. He made his A Grade debut with the OHA Hockey Club in 1985 as a 16 year old. Rowan still plays both Masters and 2nd Grade. He has represented Tasmania in fourteen Masters teams and has recently been selected in the Australian Masters O50 team.

Rowan has played 892 games for OHA, the second highest number of any male player. During his playing career he has won many premierships in A Reserve, 2nd Grade and Masters. Both his children, Isaac and Philli have played for OHA as juniors and in Premier League.

Rowan has won many awards in his 37 years with the club. He was Junior Clubman in 1982 and Senior Clubman in 2015 and 2016. He has also won numerous playing awards with the club, as well as Southern Hockey League Masters Best and Fairest Awards in 2007 and 2018.

Rowan served on the OHA Committee from 2014-2019. He was Property Officer from 2014-2016, Umpiring Co-ordinator from 2015-2016 and Vice President from 2018-2019. In 2020-2022 Rowan was Chairman of the Southern Competitions Committee. He was also Chairman of Selectors of the 2022 Tassie Tiger's women's team.

Rowan has also been umpiring for OHA at the highest level. As well as Premier League men and women, he also umpires senior men and women and junior matches.

Rowan has taken many thousands of photos of OHA players across all grades, both women and men. He also took many team photos for the OHA 100 year celebrations. Rowan photographs many Tasmanian teams whilst playing in Australian championships and keeps people informed of state team results and titles.

Rowan, with his thirty plus years of nursing has also patched up, strapped and carried off players with numerous injuries while playing and coaching. He also was involved in the successful resuscitation of a player who collapsed on the turf during training.

Rowan's contribution to coaching hockey teams is

extensive. He has coached at all levels including OHA junior teams, OHA 1st Grade men, 2nd Grade men and Masters men; Tasmanian teams - both junior and Masters and he has coached the DiamondBacks Premier League women's team for 4 years. He has won many premierships as a coach including junior OHA boys and girls teams, OHA 1st Grade men and OHA Master's teams. Rowan was recognised as Southern Hockey League Coach of the Year in 2020 for coaching the OHA 3rd Grade Red men's team and the DiamondBacks Premier League Women's team.

The original concept of creating an additional OHA 3rd Grade men's team in 2019 was the brainchild of Rowan. It was aimed at promoting hockey to juniors (Under 18s) as a way of developing their skills and resilience to play men's hockey and at a more competitive level. These juniors were otherwise unable to break into other well established teams or not able to compete at the A Pool standard. The other objective was keeping them in the sport playing during this critical time where decisions about continuing in the sport were being made as their Under 18 eligibility status was approaching the end. Rowan built the right foundations and support structures to complement playing styles. Rowan has a fantastic hockey brain honed and crafted though many years as a player and as a coach and he has utilised this to full advantage in the positive development journey of the juniors and the positive game style delivered. The 2020 performance of the team speaks for itself with the team playing in finals in 2019 and 2021.

However, what is more evident is the positive off-field culture and the respect and appreciation from the players for Rowan and his selfless dedication to support them and the sport itself. The commitments of these young adults to the team, to commit to the plan, to turn up to

training and take notice and instruction and deliver fantastically is a result of Rowan's crafted approach and plans. What resulted and for what Rowan is to be recognised for through this nomination is the success of the team both in terms of performance on the field, with the creation of the team culture from the start, development of player skills (physically & mentally) to playing men's hockey all the while making hockey fun and retaining people in the sport we all love.

Rowan is known as a go to person for a chat about anything and everything and has a vast storage of information to help people along their way. He is known for his generosity, his willingness to help people out at the drop of a hat, his passion for the game and his club, his kindness and empathetic nature and his desire to help people improve their game individually and at team level.

Outside of field hockey, Rowan has had an extensive history of playing underwater hockey. He has played and coached Tasmanian and National men's, women's and juniors to national titles. He has also played at the top level winning World Championships in France, South Africa and Hobart along with his partner Louise.

A life membership is not won, it is earned, and Rowan will join a magnificent bunch of existing Life Members of the OHA Club. The award is earned because the person wholly and unselfishly has given of themselves, not only for the OHA Club but also to the greater cause of hockey in the community. Rowan is so dedicated, loyal, passionate, and positively obsessed with hockey. His selfless contribution, his energy, his professionalism, his input and insights and his willingness to assist and deliver results to support the OHA Club are fantastic.

Rhys - You have the skill set to be a great hockey player; all you are lacking is confidence. Once you find it you will be commanding the field, not just playing on it.

Jack - You have the fitness to be a terror centre striker. If you continue to pursue hockey to a high level I'm sure you can make an impact.

Jake - Much like Rhys you have everything you need to play at a high level. The only thing you lack is your voice, particularly in Premier League. Once you find it you will find a lot more of the ball. Stay in Tassie!

Will - You can read the play of the game well and are on the right track, but remember that everyone develops at different rates. You will make it in time.

Max - Your first touch needs work. Soft hands and control of the ball as soon as you get it is the main thing letting you down. I see you becoming a leader of the club in future.

year and even though you were against players well above you in experience you kept at it. Every team needs that sort of determination.

Ben - You have the skills. Unfortunately Chris is your dad, so it'll take some time for you to fill out properly. Even being small in stature, you'll be amazed at what you can do when you protect the ball with your body.

Sam - It's probably about time you choose one sport to focus on. You

showed so much promise at the start of the season, then stopped rocking up to training. By the time you came back you almost had to start all over. No matter what sport you choose, you will do well in it. Also keep your shoulder in your socket.

Josh - You are an excellent keeper and hopefully next year you'll get more time in the net. Your adaptability is something other players never get.

Matt - I doubt there is much of anything

I can teach you on the field, but I do think it'd be good for you to play 18s again next year, even if it's just as an outlet for stress. You seemed in a much better headspace when you started playing with us.

Finally the other **Josh** - stop playing rugby; that is all.

I hope to see or hear about all of you continue to excel in whatever path you may choose.

THE OHA 100 CLUB - GAMES PLAYED

INTRODUCTION

Guidelines have been developed to provide a consistent approach for the recording of the number of games played for the Club by our members. The guidelines below also attempt to provide a fair assessment taking into consideration the changes in the Club teams over 100 years. For example, prior to the 1990's the majority of players played in only one grade in a season, compared to the present where some players play in a number of grades.

This information has been included in a database which details the games played by every OHA player from 1919 to the present. In the future, at the completion of each season, the database will be updated based on the SHL records for that season. The information will be available through the OHA Ships Log Book, to all club members, coaches and managers, to record and celebrate significant games milestones by individual players.

GUIDELINES

Games played are recorded for senior grades only and include finals matches as appropriate.

Senior grades include the Masters grade.

Where historical documents (eg; team sheets, coaches records, SHL data base [from 2016-onwards]) were available, the games played have been determined from these documents.

Where these documents were not available, the games played (including finals) have assumed to be 15-18 (based on 3 rounds) or 20-23 (based on 4 rounds) depending on the number of finals matches played.

Where a player played in more than one grade during a season, a maximum of 35 games have been recorded for that player (eg; 20 games from 3rd Grade and 15 games from 2nd grade; or 18 games from 2nd Grade and 17 games from Masters). As the SHL data base also records those players named as interchange players, these games have been included accordingly. (eg; a 4th grade player who

plays 20 games in 4th Grade and is reserve for 4 games in 3rd Grade will have 24 games recorded for the season).

Where a goalie played in goal in one grade and on the field in another a maximum of 35 games have been recorded.
