AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVES



MADDISON BROOKS

OHA has had many 'Hockeyroos' representatives in the years 1920-1950, however in the last 70 years there have only been two players selected to play for Australia. Brenda Hurst played in an international tournament conducted by the Federation of Women's Hockey Associations in Sydney in 1956. More recently Lis Paget was selected to play in a four test series in Japan in 2002.

Maddison Brooks started playing hockey at the age of four and joined OHA in 2010 playing Hookin2Hockey. Maddison's Tasmanian representative history is extensive. She played in Under 12s 2014-2016, Under 13s 2015-2017, Under 15s 2017-2019, Under 16s 2018-2020, Under 18s 2020-2023, Under 21s 2021-2023 and Tassie Tigers 2021-2023.

Maddi was named Player of the Tournament for Under 15s in 2017-2019. She was the leading goal scorer in Under 15s in 2018 and 2019. Maddi was selected in the School Sport Australia Under 16 team in 2019 and the Under 17 team in 2020.

In 2023 Maddi was selected to play in Pro League matches in Australia, New Zealand, Netherlands and Belgium. She scored her first goal as a senior player in Christchurch in April. She played in two test series in Australia against China and India.

Maddi made her Hockeyroos debut in Hobart in February with the team defeating Argentina 2-0. She has scored three goals to date and has earned 17 caps.

Maddi was also selected in the Jillaroos team to compete in the FIH Women's Junior World Cup in Santiago, Chile from 29 November - 10 December.




Australian Over 50s gold medal winning team

ROWAN BRIDLEY

Rowan has been playing hockey since 1979 joining OHA in 1979. He made his A Grade debut in 1986 and played in that team for another 19 years. He was first selected in a Tasmanian team in 2007 as a member of the Masters O40s. He played with this team for another seven years. From 2016-2019 Rowan was selected in the O45s team winning gold in 2018 and silver in 2019.

Rowan was selected in the Australian O50s team in 2019 which was to tour South Africa in 2020. However the tour did not proceed. At the 2022 Masters Championship, Rowan was selected in the O50s team to play in the Oceania Trans Tasman Masters Hockey Challenge in Christchurch, NZ in April. The team won a gold medal winning all three matches.

DARREN POON

Darren joined OHA in 2018 playing with the Masters Division 2 team. In subsequent years he has also played in 2nd, 3rd and 4th Grade.

Darren was appointed as Head Physiotherapist for Hockey Australia Masters Trans-Tasman Tournament in Christchurch (2023) and Gold Coast (2018). He has also toured with Hockey Australia Men's Masters as a Physiotherapist to the 2014 World Cup in Netherlands, 2014 Over 34s Tournament in Singapore, 2015 Trans-Tasman in Melbourne, 2016 Over 34s Tournament in Napier, New Zealand and the 2018 World Cup in Barcelona, Spain.

Darren's made his State Representative debut for Tasmania at the 2022 Hockey Australia National Tournament in the Over 34's team and achieving a bronze medal that year.

SAM MCCAMBRIDGE

Sam McCambridge began playing hockey in 1993 and joined OHA in 1997. He made his A Grade debut in 2001 playing for the next 23 years and continues to play, with a total of 444 games to date. Of these games, 380 have been in Premier League. He has won the Premier League highest goal scorer award on six occasions and has scored 347 goals in Premier League in total.

Sam has been selected in many Tasmanian teams. He was first selected in a Tasmanian team as a member of the Under 16 team in 2002. He then played in the Under 21 team from 2005-2007. He was selected in the Tassie Tigers team in 2007 and then again in 2010-2014 and 2016-2019.

Sam was first selected to play for Australia as a member of the Australia A team in Melbourne in 2013 and again in the Masters O34 team in 2023. He competed in the Oceania Trans Tasman Masters Hockey Challenge in Christchurch, NZ in April winning a gold medal.

GLENN KEATING

Glenn was destined for the OHA stronghold, playing as a nine year old at Howrah Primary School alongside fellow club members Andrew Woodberry and Mark Paynter, and coached by the late David Driver, at Clarence High School.

He further moulded his craft as a goalkeeper, most likely due to his dislike of running. Coached by Glenn Freeman in Grades 7 and 8, he got his first taste of success, which most likely cemented his pathway to a lifelong involvement in hockey. His Grade 7 team was undefeated all season with Glenn not conceding any goals! Craig Shields coached the Clarence team in Grades 8 and 9.

After leaving school, Glenn joined the Police Academy and could only play when recruitment training, studies and shift work did not interfere with Saturday competition. Then postings to New Norfolk and Kempton took him away from the club for a couple of years.

In 1990 Glenn returned to full time club hockey as the 3rd Grade keeper. However in 1991, Glenn and wife Tracey's lives and playing career took a tragic turn of events when a car accident put them both in hospital for a very long period of recovery and recuperation. Thankfully they both recovered and were able to resume playing our wonderful game.

Glenn has played an incredible 803 senior games for the OHA Hockey, reaching his 800th on 29 July this year. His career has included many premierships as well as individual awards. Glenn

was Goalkeeper of the Year in 1981, 4th Grade Best and Fairest in 2000 and 2001, 4th Grade Most Consistent in 2015 and 2016 and Clubman in 2008. Glenn was Secretary in 1994, President in 2009 and 2010, Junior Co-ordinator in 2007 and 2008 and Umpiring Co-ordinator.

At the end of 2007 season, Glenn approached the President Paul Bloomfield seeking approval to work on a project to find a new coach for the A Grade men's team which had an abundance of state juniors entering the senior ranks. A meeting with Phil Sargent and the prospective candidate, saw the appointment of Daniel Sproule (Australian, Olympic and Commonwealth Games Hockey great) as the coach of OHA Men's A Grade (now Premier League) team. After losses in the preliminary final in 2008 and the grand final in 2009, 2010 saw in the club's first A Grade men's premiership in 33 years, with further premierships in 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Outside of his 40+ years as a player and many years as a committee person, Glenn, as a parent has always been highly supportive of son, Sam and watched his development in his hockey endeavours with OHA, State and Indoor teams.

Glenn was always the quiet scout with great intel into rising talent in our junior ranks and possible player or coaching recruitments, and always provided an inclusive approach to any person that he could see would benefit our club.

There was an enormous swell of support for

Glenn's Life Membership application with constant discussion amongst the older members, not of should this happen, but when.

People are often referred to as being part of the fabric of our club. Glenn, you are better represented as being one of the pillars of our club. You have been a great bridge builder between club members, young and old, within club committees and Hockey Tasmania.

Glenn's passion, commitment and dedication to OHA put us on a great path during his time at the helm, and now 803 senior games deep, what's next?

The season certainly did not get off to a flyer with pre-season running before Christmas not garnering huge numbers, but a switch to running once per week, helped increase numbers and our last session had a healthy 20 players running around Cornelian Bay.

Post Christmas our trainings were not attended well until well into February. At this point players simply started pouring in the door! The addition of turf time certainly seemed to up the players' excitement and commitment levels! At the start of the season, we had a large squad to pick from and many players missed out. First Grade also had a solid squad ready to go from

round 1.

The first half of the season was a real mixed bag, with big steps forward, followed by big steps back the following week. We were starting to get some consistency and certainly looking more dangerous offensively. The arrival of Ollie Smith back from UK certainly helped. His constant old man's back and dodgy hammies throughout the season, was frustrating for him, robbing the group of the dynamic playmaker we desperately needed. Unfortunately, Sammy Mac started getting old also in 2023, with the dreaded calf sidelining him in the early part of the season. With Sammy on the field our young forward line grows wings, and he is still one of the best finishers in the game. I look forward to him coming back to PL in 2024 for one last dance (or maybe 2!).

The best thing about our season was the development of our youth. It was the youth that made me want to sign up to coach this team. The young guys did a great job doubling up for 1st grade and PL constantly in the back half of the year. First grade being in the hunt for a premiership certainly

helped this, it gave the group the lift they needed to keep going.

Where to now. I am keen to continue this journey with this great bunch of lads. They are capable, they can do great things. They simply need to understand and commit to the hard work required. I can't do this for them. Fitness is key. We did not get the kms in the legs early and as a result we weren't

able to truly build ourselves for the season. This must have contributed to injuries. Well in fact – it did cause injuries. I've spoken at Silly Sunday about this, I spoke post the last game. We can enjoy a break, but we need to get cracking fast. We must bullet proof our bodies and get ready for a big year. We have such huge improvements to make to consider making finals. It will come from within the group and within

each player.

Fitness first, then skills, then structure.

THE OHA 100 CLUB - GAMES PLAYED

INTRODUCTION

Guidelines have been developed to provide a consistent approach for the recording of the number of games played for the Club by our members. The guidelines below also attempt to provide a fair assessment taking into consideration the changes in the club teams over 100 years. For example, prior to the 1990's the majority of players played in only one grade in a season, compared to the present where some players play in a number of grades.

This information has been included in a database which details the games played by every OHA player from 1919 to the present. At the completion of each season, the database is updated based on the SHL records for that season. The information will be available throughout the season and recorded in the OHA Ships Log Book, to all club members, coaches and managers, to record and celebrate significant games milestones by individual players.

GUIDELINES

Games played are recorded for senior grades only and include finals matches as appropriate.

Senior grades include the Masters grade.

Where historical documents (eg; team sheets, coaches records, SHL data base [from 2016-onwards]) were available, the games played have been determined from these documents.

Where these documents were not available, the games played (including finals) have assumed to be 15-18 (based on 3 rounds) or 20-23 (based on 4 rounds) depending on the number of finals matches played.

Where a player played in more than one grade during a season, a maximum of 35 games have been recorded for that player (eg; 20 games from 3rd Grade and 15 games from 2nd grade; or 18 games from 2nd Grade and 17 games from Masters). As the SHL data base also records those players named as interchange

players, these games have been included accordingly. (eg; a 4th grade player who plays 20 games in 4th Grade and is reserve for 4 games in 3rd Grade will have 24 games recorded for the season).

Where a goalie played in goal in one grade and on the field in another a maximum of 35 games have been recorded.

AMENDMENTS TO GAMES PLAYED

The following table lists the games played for each OHA club member based on the above guidelines and the information we have been able to access to date.

If any individual member wishes to review their personal games record, feel free to contact me (see contact details below) to arrange this. We are also keen to update the data base based on any new documentation (eg; old team books, club records, personal records, team photographs, newspaper articles) so if anyone has this information please let me know, and we can amend the data base accordingly.
