2024 PRESIDENTS REPORT

Taking the helm of this ship has been a privilege but also a huge learning curve for me, probably not realising how much work is required to steer this club through the year but also to plan for the future of the club.

The 2024 season has been a season of triumphs and challenges. We have some very dedicated people - players, coaches, umpires and supporters. The Committee and I would like to pass on our gratitude and an immensely big thank you to all our coaches and players of 2024, for making this a successful year for OHA Hockey Club.

Thank you to our club sponsors. We wouldn't be here today without the support from The Maypole (Kristy Johnston and Greg Rogers) and Battery World (Graeme Cowie). ANZ has continued to support the club with the home loan introduction scheme.

With the new start in 2024 and with big shoes to fill as Emma Byrne decided to step down (but I did convince Emma to stay as our Junior Vice President), I took on the role of president for the year. It has been a very difficult year as I was still chairing the Southern Competitions Committee for the Southern Hockey League, playing, coaching, umpiring and obviously still trying to do a day job as well. This club has been a huge part of my life but the enjoyment of playing this great sport is why I took on this role.

The season for OHA was a pretty impressive

year. We had four teams win minor premierships - Men's Masters Division 2 Blue, 1st Grade Men, 2nd Grade Men and 3rd Grade Men Red. We had five teams play in grand finals - Men's Masters Division 2 Blue, 1st Grade Men, 1st Grade Women, 2nd Grade Men and 3rd Grade Men Red. 1st Grade Men and 2nd Grade Men won premierships.

The Southern Hockey League Awards night saw multiple Best and Fairest winners. Women's Masters Division 1 - Sofie McLeod, Women's Masters Division 3 - Kylee Chivers, 2nd Grade Men - David Woolford, 5th Grade Men - Stuart Miller and 1st Grade Women - Sofie McLeod.

The club was well represented with four members coaching State teams. Phil Sargent coached Under 15 girls, Susan Brooks Under 18 girls and the Women's Hockey One Tassie Tigers, Dave Woolford Masters Over 40 and Rowan Bridley Masters Over 55.

Four players - James Cowling, Shenan Daniels, Matt Sargent, and Matt Turner won a gold medal in the Masters Over 50 National Championships held in Hobart.

Sofie McLeod and Leanne Fung won a silver medal in the Masters Over 40 in Sydney. Sofie also was Player of the Final and Top Goal Scorer for the competition - an absolute standout year. David McCambridge, Harry Laughlin and Sam McCambridge won a silver in the Masters Over 34 and Darren Poon, Aaron Guillamse and

Dave Woolford (coach) won a silver medal in the Masters Over 40.

We have also had great year with many club members selected in Australian teams. Abby Sargent was selected in the Under 15 All Australian team. Five players played in the Masters World Cup in South Africa in October. Sofie McLeod - Over 35 team, Sam McCambridge (vice captain) - Over 35s, David Woolford Over 40s, David McCambridge Over 35s A team, Leanne Fung - Over 40s A team. Rowan Bridley played in the Over 55s in Auckland in November.

The pinnacle of the year was to see Maddison Brooks achieve her dream of being selected in the Hockeyroos. Maddi played in Europe in the FIH Pro League and then went on to the Paris Olympic Games. To see a player from Tasmania and the OHA Hockey Club excel at this level was a fantastic achievement.

I would like to thank our Junior Committee this year with an outstanding job done by all in the difficult year that it was. Hockey Australia had changed the age groups again back to the original age groups of about five years ago with Under 12s, 14s, 16s and 18s and we were fighting in the middle as players had aged out and moved before getting the challenge of two years in an age group. This also made a lot of doubling up.

The Junior Committee was made up of Emma Byrne (Vice President), Jane Sargent (Junior Girls Coordinator), Andrew Byrne (Junior Boys

Coordinator), Dave McCambridge (Hookin2Hockey Coordinator) and Nikki Stuart (Junior Development Officer). We would also like to thank all the coaches and those who supported teams in 2024. The tireless work done by this group will be setting up OHA for the future.

This year we have seen our OHA Junior Academy re-energised with the new name of 'OHA Futures'. Thanks go to Nikki Stuart, our Junior Development Officer who has driven and organised the program. Our OHA juniors will need to be an urgent priority in 2025 and we seek your assistance to improve our current situation. We need more player numbers, coaches and support to get our junior teams back to where they were 7-10 years ago. To increase numbers of players in Tasmania the sport needs support from you, friends, family members of our clubs and the schools.

I would also like to extend a special thanks to our umpires and technical officers, who play a vital role in the game. Thank you to Joshua Foulston who again took on the important role of Umpire Coordinator. Thank you for all your efforts organising our umpires. I believe Joshua is stepping down from the role to concentrate on his hockey.

I would like to thank our 2024 Committee for their work during the season, they don't get the recognition they deserve and their tireless efforts to run this club is very much underestimated.





Hockeyroos Maddi Brooks

MADDISON BROOKS

Congratulations to Maddi Brooks who played in the 2024 Paris Olympics Games. What an incredible achievement and experience for our hometown OHA club member.

Maddi Brooks debuted for the Hockeyroos in 2023 and in 2024 she continued her representation which culminated in her selection for the Olympic Games as a travelling reserve. It is the first time a current OHA player has ever been selected for an Olympic Games.

Maddi's year began with Pro-League matches played in India and Belgium in February, May and June. She played 12 matches and scored a goal against the USA in Rourkela, India. Australia finished sixth in the competition. This was followed by the Perth International Festival of Hockey. The Hockeyroos played four matches against Japan and China. Maddi played three matches, winning two and scoring two goals.

Maddi travelled to Paris with the Hockeyroos as a reserve and was not expecting to play any matches. However, she was delighted to be included in the squad when another player withdrew with an injury. She played four of the five pool matches. In her first match Australia defeated South Africa 2-1. In her next match Australia defeated the USA 3-0 and Maddi scored her first Olympic goal. A draw with Argentina and a win against Spain saw the Hockeyroos finish on top of their pool.

The Hockeyroos played China, who had finished fourth in Pool A, in the quarter final. They lost the match 3-2.

Maddi reflected:

'My Olympic experience was incredible and I gained so much experience and knowledge both on and off the field. Heading over to Paris as a travelling reserve I had no real expectations, I was just happy to be a part of the experience. So, to be called up for the first game was an awesome feeling. Stepping onto the pitch for the very first time, with a packed stadium, made every moment feel surreal. To be on the end of an incredible team play and score my first Olympic goal against the USA was definitely a highlight. Other highlights included the opportunity to meet famous athletes, the dining hall where there was a diverse range of cuisines, watching the rugby 7s and water polo live, the overall team camaraderie within the Australian team, and the opportunity to explore Paris. Overall, it was an unforgettable experience and I'm so grateful for the opportunity.'

Maddi has 36 Hockeyroo caps and has scored 7 goals.

SAMUEL MCCAMBRIDGE

Sam's Australian representation continued in 2024 when he was named as vice-captain of the Australian O35 team to compete in the Master's World Cup in Cape Town in October 2024. His team won three of their four pool matches defeating France, South Africa and the IMC South African team and drew with Germany 2-2. Finishing top of their pool, Australia was defeated 4-3 by England in the semi-final and they won a bronze medal defeating New Zealand 3-2. Sam scored five goals in the tournament.

Sam has been named as vice-captain to play in the Trans Tasman Challenge against New Zealand in Cairns in May 2025.

DAVID MCCAMBRIDGE

David started playing hockey for Princes Street Primary School in 1994. He joined OHA in 1996 playing in the Under 13 team. He continued through the junior hockey ranks and joined the A Reserve (Now 1st Grade) team in 2001. Over the next four years David played in the A Reserve team and in 1st Grade (now Premier League) in 2005. After an absence from the state, he returned in 2013 to play in the 1st and 2nd Grade teams and commenced in Masters in 2019. David won his first ever senior premiership with the Masters team in 2021 followed by a win in 2nd Grade in 2023 and a 1st Grade premiership in 2024.

David's first state representation was in 2023 when he was selected in O34 Tasmanian team to compete in the Australian Master's Championships in Perth. Following this carnival David was selected in the O35 Australia International Masters Cup (IMC) team as vice-captain, to compete at the Master's World Cup in Cape Town, South Africa in October. The IMC is a competition for non-national teams, national 'B' teams and runs alongside the Masters World Cup. Competing as Australia A, the team was included in the Masters World Cup pool matches as only one other country - South Africa fielded a IMC team. David's team lost four of their pool matches against Wales, England, New Zealand, Scotland and drew 3-3 with Zimbabwe. Playing against the South African IMC in the final, they were defeated 2-1 and won the silver medal.

AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVES

ROWAN BRIDLEY

To build on his Australian O50 selection for the Trans Tasman Challenge played in May 2023 against New Zealand, Rowan was again selected to play for Australia at the 2023 Australian Master's Championships held in Perth in October. He was a member of the O55 Australian team to compete in the Master's World Cup in Auckland in November 2024. Rowan played four pool matches against Wales, New Zealand, USA and Malaysia winning every match. The team defeated South Africa in the semi-final 3-2 but lost the gold medal match against England 4-2. Rowan won a silver medal in his first World Cup appearance.

SOPHIE MCLEOD

Sofie's hockey journey began at the Friends School in 1985 playing in the school Minkey team. Sofie played her first OHA match in the Under 12 team winning the premiership. Sofie played her first 1st Grade (now Premier League) match in 2000 at the age of 14. As a member of this team for the next 12 years, she won five premierships and four state finals. Sofie played in the 2013 premiership team and then after a four year break from hockey returned to play in Premier League team from 2018-2024.

Sofie has been selected in multiple junior Tasmanian teams and was first selected in the Van Demons (now Tassie Tigers) team in 2003. She played with Van Demons from 2003-2008, 2010-2011 and 2018, named as vice-captain in 2013 and 2018.

In 2003, Sofie was selected in the Australian Under 18 team playing against New Zealand in the Rose Quaid Cup which was won by Australia. The following year, Sofie was selected in the Australian Under 21 Junior World Cup squad and toured Europe with an Australian Institute of Sport team. Sofie played against China in a test series in 2004 and was named in the Australian Junior World Cup squad in 2005.

Sofie was selected in the Australian Masters O35 team at the 2023 Australian Master's Championships to compete in the World Cup in Cape Town, South Africa in October 2024. In the pool matches Sofie's team defeated the USA and New Zealand and drew with Hong Kong and the Netherlands. The team was defeated 2-0 by South Africa in the semi-final and they lost the bronze medal match 4-3 to England. Sofie scored two goals during the tournament.

At the 2024 Australian Masters Championships, Sofie was selected in the O40 team to play in the Trans Tasman Challenge against New Zealand in Cairns in May 2025.

AUSTRALIAN REPRESENTATIVES

LEANNE FUNG

Leanne began playing hockey at high school in Victoria. After moving to Tasmania in 2010, she played club hockey in Launceston. Exploring hockey in Hobart, she joined OHA in 2022.

Leanne was first selected in a Masters team in 2019 playing for a Tasmania/South Australia team. From 2021-2024 Leanne has played in Tasmanian teams at the Australian Master's Championships.

At the 2023 Australian Master's Championships Leanne was selected in the O40 Australian International Masters Cup (IMC) team. The IMC is a competition for non-national teams, national 'B' teams and runs alongside the Masters World Cup. The competition was held in Cape Town, South Africa in October 2024.

As there were only three IMC teams in the O40 age group, they were all included in the World Cup pool matches. Leanne's team defeated Argentina, South Africa and IMC team Alliance and their only loss was to Wales. In the semi-final, Leanne's team defeated South Africa 4-0 and they went on to win the gold medal match, again defeating South Africa 4-0. Leanne scored two goals in the competition.

David has been selected in a number of Tasmanian teams. He was selected in the Tassie Tigers in 2001-2004, the Under 21 team in 2000-2004, Under 18 in 2000-2001 and Under 15 in 1997-1998. David has won numerous playing awards for the club and the Southern Hockey League.

At the 2023 Australian Master's Championships, David was selected in the O40 Australian team to compete in the World Cup in Cape Town, South Africa in October 2024. David played against the South African IMC team, Argentina, France and New Zealand winning all four pool matches. Finishing top of their pool, the team defeated France 7-0 in the qualifying round and New Zealand 5-0 in the semi-final. In the gold medal match, David's team was defeated 3-1 by South Africa, winning the silver medal.

At the 2024 Australian Master's Championships in Hobart, David was selected in the O40 team to play in the Trans Tasman Challenge against New Zealand in Cairns in May 2025.

Sofie McLeod took control over the midfield. She inspired both youth and experienced campaigners with a masterclass style and determination, that eventually saw Sofie take out both the team and association Best and Fairest.

The last round saw us gain momentum and secure second place and a double chance in the final series.

Semi final action against the DiamondBacks delivered a clear message with a 5-1 loss. Thankfully the double chance, a team reset, and the pace of this side exploited an ageing Derwent and provided a confidence boost to the team. A 4-1 preliminary final win put us through to the grand final – a rematch against DiamondBacks.

The OHA women gave everything in the grand final. Dominating the first three quarters with multiple penalty corners and goal mouth scrimmages, only to be held at bay by an equally determined opposition

goalie. In an incredibly high tempo game, the DiamondBacks eventually asserted their season dominance in the last quarter, but our defensive unit was equal to the task though and held firm. Led by goalkeeper, Madison Godfrey, and a brilliant sliding goal line save and clearance by captain Dayna Challis, the team kept DiamondBacks scoreless.

A 0-0 full time scoreline would see the grand final go to shoot outs. Unfortunately for our incredibly versatile mix of youth and experience, OHA would succumb to a 3-2 loss. Heartbreaking scenes for a team with incredible skill balance, intelligence, a spirit of fair play (two green cards for the season), and togetherness. We will take this loss, learn from it, to regroup and plan for the 2025 season.

THE OHA 100 CLUB - GAMES PLAYED

INTRODUCTION

Guidelines have been developed to provide a consistent approach for the recording of the number of games played for the Club by our members. The guidelines below also attempt to provide a fair assessment taking into consideration the changes in the club teams over 100 years. For example, prior to the 1990's the majority of players played in only one grade in a season, compared to the present where some players play in a number of grades.

This information has been included in a database which details the games played by every OHA player from 1919 to the present. At the completion of each season, the database is updated based on the SHL records for that season. The information will be available throughout the season and recorded in the OHA Ships Log Book, to all club members, coaches and managers, to record and celebrate significant games milestones by individual players.

GUIDELINES

Games played are recorded for senior grades only and include finals matches as appropriate.

Senior grades include the Masters grade.

Where historical documents (eg; team sheets, coaches records, SHL data base [from 2016-onwards]) were available, the games played have been determined from these documents.

Where these documents were not available, the games played (including finals) have assumed to be 15-18 (based on 3 rounds) or 20-23 (based on 4 rounds) depending on the number of finals matches played.

Where a player played in more than one grade during a season, a maximum of 35 games have been recorded for that player (eg; 20 games from 3rd Grade and 15 games from 2nd grade; or 18 games from 2nd Grade and 17 games from Masters). As the SHL data base also records those players named as interchange

players, these games have been included accordingly. (eg; a 4th grade player who plays 20 games in 4th Grade and is reserve for 4 games in 3rd Grade will have 24 games recorded for the season).

Where a goalie played in goal in one grade and on the field in another a maximum of 35 games have been recorded.

AMENDMENTS TO GAMES PLAYED

The following table lists the games played for each OHA club member based on the above guidelines and the information we have been able to access to date.

If any individual member wishes to review their personal games record, feel free to contact me (see contact details below) to arrange this. We are also keen to update the data base based on any new documentation (eg; old team books, club records, personal records, team photographs, newspaper articles) so if anyone has this information please let me know, and we can amend the data base accordingly.

Also included below is a list of players who have achieved a new games milestone in this season.

PREMIER LEAGUE GAMES PLAYED

A new data base included this year is the number of games played in Premier League over our 100+ year history. The database includes those players who have played 100 games or more.

The definition of 'Premier League' includes the previous names for this grade including; First Grade, 1st Grade and A-Grade.
